Trips & Visits

You will have seen in the last newsletter and below some of the trips and visits we have at Unicorn, which the children always enjoy. We strive to keep costs as low as possible when asking for voluntary contributions, which are based on the full class attending. However, without these essential contributions, we may have to stop offering these activities which enrich the curriculum. Of course, we understand there are some families struggling financially at the moment and do not want to add to these difficulties, but we also have a very limited school budget. To date we are in arrears of nearly £100 from non payments. Please consider this when giving your consent for the trip/visit. Thank you to the FUN Committee for organising events which raise funds that we can use to help keep costs down.

Head Lice

We have had repeated cases of headlice in multiple year groups this half term, so we would urge everyone to **check** their children's hair regularly and treat if necessary. It is important to keep checking for at least two weeks after you first spot eggs to ensure all lice have gone. It is also essential that **everyone** does this to eliminate the problem or the lice will keep moving from head to head in the classroom, which can become an expensive and irritating problem.

We have received several complaints from our neighbours recently about inconsiderate parking across driveways and dropped curbs in the next door Cala estate and rude behaviour from parents, as well as parking in the disabled bays in the school carpark. *Please can we remind everyone to follow the Highway Code and our in house Rules of the Car Park (see below).*

Library Update

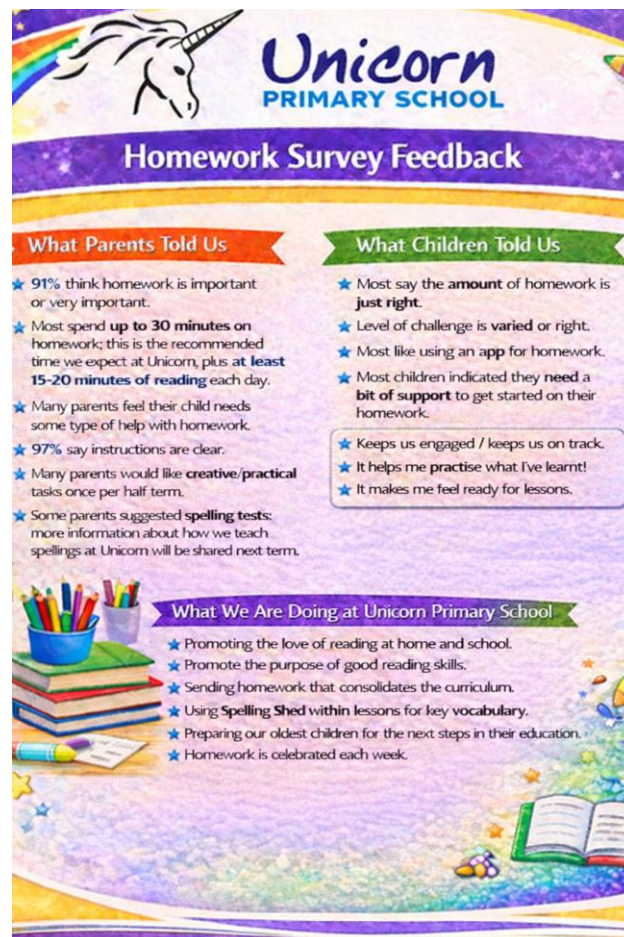

What Parents Told Us

- ★ 91% think homework is important or very important.
- ★ Most spend **up to 30 minutes** on homework; this is the recommended time we expect at Unicorn, plus **at least 15-20 minutes of reading** each day.
- ★ Many parents feel their child needs some type of help with homework.
- ★ 97% say instructions are clear.
- ★ Many parents would like **creative/practical** tasks once per half term.
- ★ Some parents suggested **spelling tests**; more information about how we teach spellings at Unicorn will be shared next term.

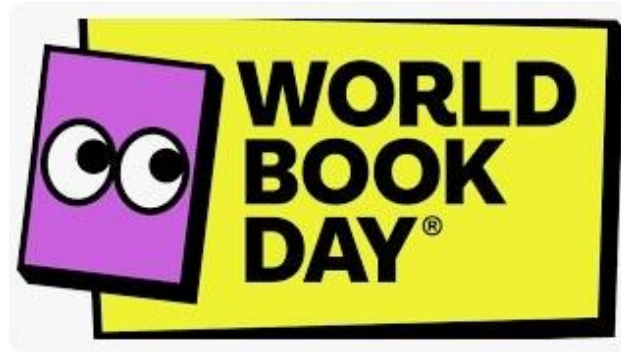
What Children Told Us

- ★ Most say the **amount** of homework is **just right**.
- ★ Level of challenge is **varied** or right.
- ★ Most like using an **app** for homework.
- ★ Most children indicated they **need a bit of support** to get started on their homework.

- ★ It helps me **practise** what I've learnt!
- ★ It makes me feel ready for lessons.

Then we had to get our jobs, one by one and I got the hardest one of all - a farm picker. I had to keep the pigs in their pen and we had to collect wheat. It was very hard. It was a very fun day!

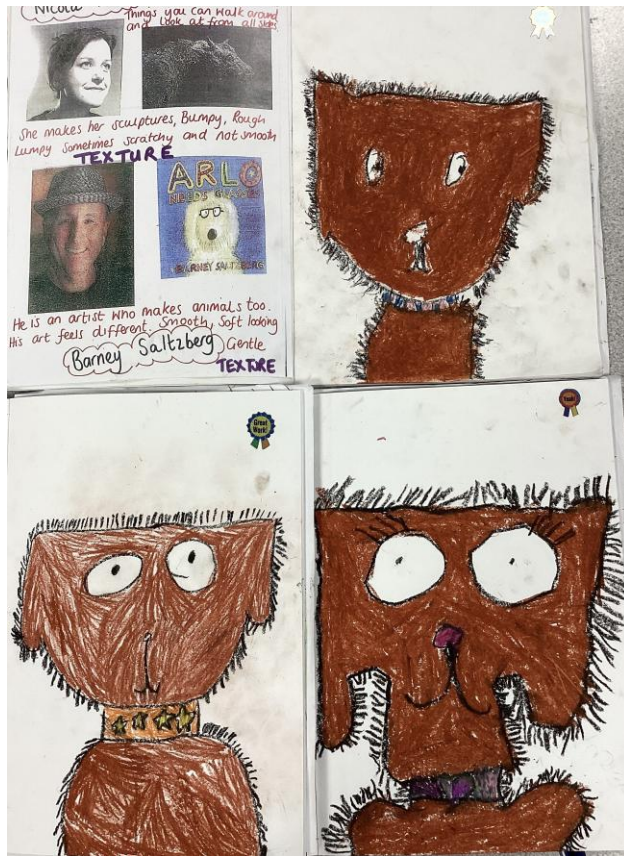


Art @ Unicorn

Year 2 have been investigating Rene Magritte and Salvador Dali. They have been exploring Surrealism and creating Magritte's famous apple containing something dream like and from their imagination.

Year 3 have been looking at Balance, Colour and Pattern. They have compared William Morris and Lois Malou Jones and created their own wallpaper design using foam shapes to print with.

Heijoshin provides Ju-Jitsu training for children from 4.5 years through to adults, based out of various Bromley Schools.

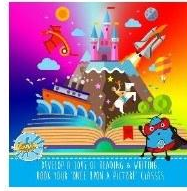
